## PREVENT THE SPREAD OF DISEASES AND RELATED ISSUES IN BEEKEEPING

We strongly urge all exhibitors to remain fully committed to preventing any risk of spreading diseases, pests, or other related issues within beekeeping. The transfer of beekeeping-related products across borders always carries a potential risk, which could have serious consequences for the entire industry.

The organizers of Apimondia 2025, in collaboration with the Danish authorities, are placing high priority on minimizing such risks. We therefore appeal to all exhibitors to act responsibly and with great caution. Please ensure full compliance with all applicable regulations and take every possible measure to prevent any situation that could pose a risk of spreading diseases or related challenges in beekeeping.

We recognize that the beekeeping community is generally very conscientious in this regard, and we look forward to welcoming you to Apimondia 2025.

## RULES FOR IMPORTING TO DENMARK IN CONNECTION WITH THE APIEXPO

For food products, this constitutes commercial importation.

Goods from Third Countries (outside the EU) related to ApiEXPO

Equipment suppliers from third countries must find a Danish representative in order to import their products into the EU.

Participation in ApiEXPO involves commercial importation, and the products intended for consumption (including health food products) must:

• Be subject to border control if listed with a CN code in Regulation 2021/632 (<u>Implementing Regulation - 2021/632 - EN - EUR-Lex</u>). A CHED (Common Health Entry Document) must be created in TRACES, addressed to the approved Border Control Post at the first point of entry into the EU.

• Originate from an approved third country (<u>Regulation 2021/405 – Implementing Regulation - 2021/405 – EN - EUR-Lex</u>).

 Come from an approved establishment (<u>Regulation 2022/2292 – Delegated Regulation - 2022/2292 - EN</u> <u>- EUR-Lex</u> and TRACES – <u>Log in - TRACES NT</u>).

• Be accompanied by a health certificate (Regulation 2020/2235 [Annex III, Chapter 45] – <u>Implementing</u> Regulation - 2020/2235 - EN - EUR-Lex).

## LIVE BEES AND OTHER ANIMALS ARE NOT PERMITTED AT THE CONGRESS

We kindly remind all participants that, in accordance with the congress regulations, live bees and other live animals are not permitted at ApiEXPO or in any other part of the congress.

Visual and technical solutions are generally sufficient and effective in conveying the fascinating world of bees without the need for live specimens.
